- Resilient Communities Initiative: after completing the training phase of our flagship program, we started the seed funding phase of our work. In this period, we received over 120 proposals for income diversification projects, out of which 76 were selected for seed funds. This year, we will distribute \$28,000 in seed funds to support farmer designed and led projects.
- Women-Powered Coffee Summit: we hosted the 2nd Women-Powered Coffee Summit between Nov 2-4 in Costa Rica! This was an exciting milestone for our team and we are excited to share the report from the Summit here.
- Renewed Partnership with ICAFE: our team is excited to announce the ongoing partnership with the Coffee Institute of Costa Rica, now entering its fifth year. We are grateful to the staff at ICAFE for being such fundamental partners in our progress, and bringing such helpful resources to smallholder women coffee farmers in Costa Rica.
